

## VISIT SIDNEY

Sidney, Ohio, will welcome the CSBA to the Shelby County Fairground. Sidney is a city of 21,500 people. The Shelby County Fairground is in the south side of Sidney. It is easily accessed from Highway 75 (runs north-south) with an east turn on Fair Road. Far more information can be found at <https://www.visitsidneyshelby.com>.

There is much to explore in Shelby County and Sidney. Sidney was established as the county seat of Shelby County in 1819. Land was donated along the Great Miami River and named for Sir Phillip Sidney, an English writer. The historic section of Sidney rims the Great Miami River and is a marvelous way to explore the city. A downtown 'must-do' checklist for historic, downtown Sidney includes:

1. Treat yourself to a chocolate shake at Chilly Jilly's.
2. Grab a selfie and slice of homemade pie at the world-famous Spot Restaurant.
3. Tour Sidney's finest home, GreatStone Castle.
4. See the Monumental Building-a tribute to fallen Civil War heroes.
5. Hike to Big Rock and then onto the covered bridge at Tawawa Park.
6. Grab a cold cocktail at Murphy's Craft Bar + Kitchen or KB's Tap House.
7. Have dinner at The Bridge restaurant or lunch at the Spot Restaurant.
